I am honored to be a part of a movement that is forging the path for equity and access for all entrepreneurs. Thank you to the WEDO Awards and to everyone who has supported my journey this far. Let's continue to rise together."

When you are a runner, you run, a sport that requires only shoes and stamina. Noor Alexandria Abukaram's entrepreneurial spirit was sparked when in 2019 as a 16-year-old she was disqualified for running with her hijab on at an Ohio track meet. After shaking off her embarrassment, she founded Let Noor Run - which fights discrimination and injustices, hindering those from doing what they love. In 2021, Ohio Senate Bill 181 was unanimously passed to end discrimination against religious expression for student-athletes.



As a successful social media influencer and product representative, Noor's reach is international. Her corporate partners include Nike and "Gonna Need Milk". Ms. Aburkaram has been featured in the Washington Post, The New York Times, Good Morning America, Time Magazine, CNN, Sports Illustrated, and ESPN, and is now at Ohio State University pursuing a career in design and sports. She represents the future of women not only in sports but also in standing up for what is right.

Erin Curley is the owner and sole inspiration at Engage Studio Architects. She discovered her love of design in high school and went on to become a trained, qualified architect and a member of the prestigious American Institute of Architects.

When her career in Toledo took a change in 2019, she opened her own firm. In less than a year she was successfully running Engage Studio Architects in a pandemic. She has grown this business year after year, with new projects that are predominately community enhancements. She has made this happen with her own grit and capital.

Ambrea Mikolajczyk

Trailblazer Awardee

An innovator, creator and leader, who has broken new ground as a woman entrepreneur.

"I feel so incredibly honored to receive this inaugural award, to be recognized for the hard work I do in the community restoring forgotten architecture and contributing to many causes in order to move the needle forward in my hometown is something I will always treasure."

Ambrea was working in Corporate America for the largest pharmaceutical company in the world as a sales manager. Something inside of her kept screaming, "There is more." Meanwhile, she and her husband Kevin were purchasing rundown, forgotten about houses and working to make them whole again. Ambrea fell in love with the entire process of managing a budget, schedule, vendors, and materials, partnering with sub-contractors, and organizing a team to bring the properties online.

In 2015 she was renovating a former Tobacco factory in Downtown Toledo's Warehouse District, and people in the community took notice and asked if they could hire ARK to help with the renovations to their homes, businesses, and buildings.



This is when Ambrea realized this was the answer to "there is more,". In 2017 she resigned from her successful career to launch ARK Restoration and Construction.

It is challenging being a woman and navigating in an industry dominated by men. Ambrea has had to prove that she is worthy, knowledgeable, and capable of being in this space. Recently, she was competing to be the chosen developer for the Spitzer Arcade and Nicholas buildings with ARK's partner out of Cincinnati, The Model Group. Selected from a field of eight development teams Ambrea and The Model Group demonstrated skill and capacity and were selected to redevelop these iconic Toledo landmarks, proving Ambrea is a true trailblazer.






Jeraldine Stewart

A woman whose entrepreneurial leadership has grown and sustained a business, meeting increasingly higher levels of achievement in revenue, job creation and market share.



Jera Stewart, owner of Jera's Heavenly Sweet Bakery, started with a passion for baking, learning from her mom. Having successfully raised her children, she and her husband decided to go big and opened a location on Summit St in downtown Toledo in the One SeaGate building.

When she won the competitive JumpStart pitch competition grand prize, she used her winnings to move her bakery to a promising new location. Then the pandemic hit. Using retirement savings and PPP grants, she continued following her dream.

Jera did pop-ups, deliveries, and more to continue the business while building the new location.



In March of 2021, her husband of 35 years died and her business became the lifeline to keep her moving forward, and move forward she did. Now, with over ten employees, she is a popular spot for coffee and sweets with both the neighborhood and University of Toledo students. Her secret to success is that she never takes "no" for an answer. Her desire to give back has her making over 200 cakes for community foster children to enjoy having a real birthday cake. At 66, she is the first to say, you are never too old to make a difference!

Legend Award

A woman we celebrate for a lifetime of entrepreneurial achievement, community impact, and support of the success of others.

"I transform every passion that I have into a business. That's why I love what I do and I hope to inspire you!"

For Tina Butts, providing bail bond services is more than a financial transaction. Tina provides criminal and janitorial bonds, travel checks, and guardianship documents to help ensure that the criminal justice system is fair, equitable, and accessible to everyone, regardless of financial means. Tina founded "Here's your turning point, LLC," an addiction recovery and mental health treatment center to help families in crisis. Her personal, professional, and community experiences led Tine to create "The Movement". When the Covid Pandemic hit our community in March 2020, Tina saw the need to help black and brown people understand the importance of vaccinating against COVID-19.

Thousands received the vaccine through her efforts. In one afternoon, 500 people received the vaccine. Today, The Movement has enlisted the assistance of thousands of volunteers who have registered hundreds of voters and coordinated holiday baskets, bikes, and backpack giveaways. Through all of Tina's companies, she has partnered with Toledo Public Schools, Pathway, Inc., and many other community agencies to provide help and a voice to those in need

The area with the greatest need for improvement was creating narratives pertaining to the ecosystem's authentic storytelling that highlights its personality and diversity.




One of the ways for improvement is to develop an award and/or recognition of excellence for diverse entrepreneurs and ecosystem leaders.






